Fundraising activities allow us to expand upon our program options and offer programming to more individuals in need of service.

Dear North East Community:

I hope this letter finds you and your family well.

We are very excited to share our Winter/Spring Brochure with you. The staff have been extremely busy planning some great trips, activities and events. As always, we hope North East Westchester Special Recreation offers something of interest for everyone.

I strongly encourage you to register your child early. Many of our Fall programs reached capacity within the first two weeks of registration.

North East Westchester Special Recreation receives funding from New York's Office for People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) and the twelve municipalities in our Consortium. There is one program/activity fee for residents of the twelve municipalities and/or are approved by OPWDD. If the participant is a non-resident and not approved for OPWDD respite services, a separate program fee is charged. This is the same fee that is charged for individuals residing in certified residential facilities.

If you have not yet done so already, you are encouraged to enroll your child with NYS OPWDD. If eligible, there are multiple services your child may be eligible to receive. You can begin the process by contacting Frandy Osias at OPWDD's regional office in Tarrytown at (914)332-8961.

If your child presents any symptoms of illness, please keep them at home. We will continue to follow safety guidelines as determined by NY Office for People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) and NY Department of Health. We will also adhere to a venue or attraction's specific safety protocols.

Every participant will need to have a signed "Participant Coronavirus/COVID-19 Waiver" on file in order to participate in programs. This form is available on our website, or simply call our office and a form will be sent to you.

If situations beyond our control force us to cancel, delay or change the program's schedule, we will make every effort to contact families. Program cancellations due to in-climate weather will also be posted on WHUD's Storm Center.

REGISTRATION:

Each participant in a North East program must have a current Participant Information Form on file. Participants presently enrolled in a North East program may register using the attached Program Registration form. Registration may also be completed online by visiting our website. (www.northeastspecialrec.org) *If you are late in registering, this will cause a delay in when you are able to start program.*

SESSION DATES: January 16 to May 4, 2024

Registration for in-district residents begins immediately. Participants are enrolled in programs on a first-come, first-served basis. Many of our programs fill quickly, so please register as soon as possible. Registration for outof-district residents begins on **January 4**, 2024. You may send your registration to us prior to that date and we will hold it until the 4th. At that time, out-of-district residents will be accepted in the order the registrations were received by our office, as room permits.

TRANSPORTATION:

While North East is able to provide transportation for several programs, please consider car pooling and paratransit when possible. Due to the number of requests, we are able to provide transportation from central locations only.

LATE PICK-UPS:

If you are late in picking up, we have to pay our staff for the time they must wait with participants after program. For this reason, we reserve the right to charge \$10 for every 15 minutes you are late in order to attempt to cover some of our staff cost.

New to North East Programs:

North East proudly serves children, teens and adults with developmental disabilities who reside in our consortium region: Bedford, Briarcliff, Lewisboro, Mt. Kisco, Mt. Pleasant, New Castle, North Castle, North Salem, Pleasantville, Pound Ridge, Sleepy Hollow, and Somers. Each municipality help to financially support North East.

Anyone new to North East must schedule an intake meeting with one of our Recreation Therapists. Please call our office, 914-347-4409 as soon as you can to make sure the desired programs still have availability. During the intake meeting, you, your child, and our staff will work together to determine which programs will be best suited and of interest to your child.

North East can no longer accept new registrants who are 21 years of age or older residing outside our consortium region who are not approved by OPWDD for respite services.

For new Individuals who are enrolled with HCBS Medicaid Waiver and are 21 years & older: North East will only accept those residing outside of our consortium region who are approved for respite services. Individual may not start programs until all required documentation is properly submitted by Care Manager or Parent. Documents include Service Authorization, Notice of Decision, Level of Care, and the Life Plan. North East must be included in the person's Life Plan. Individuals may not begin programs until North East is notified the billing for reimbursement process is completed.

The required forms for new applicants and registration can be found on our website. If you need, just call our office and we can email or mail forms to you. Please bring the completed forms to the scheduled intake meeting.

We are continually assessing our programs and the needs of our participants. We reserve the right to change or recommend alternative programs to best meet the needs of the participants. We will discuss all recommendations; the final decision will be with North East.

PROGRAM/ACTIVITY FEES:

Program/Activity Fees cover the cost to operate programs that OPWDD/Medicaid do not cover. These fees are only a small percent of our actual operating costs. Fees are paid once program acceptance is confirmed. Registering does not guarantee placement. If participant has an outstanding balance, they will not be able to register/attend future programs until the balance is paid in full.

In-District and/or OPWDD Approved: Individuals residing in our consortium region and/or OPWDD approved for respite services will share the same program fee.

Out-of-District and NOT OPWDD Approved: Individuals who are not OPWDD approved for respite services and live outside our consortium region will have a separate fee to help cover operating costs that would otherwise by funded by OPWDD/Medicaid.

Payment Plan or scholarship information is provided upon request.

Unfortunately, we will have to charge \$20 for any checks returned to us for Insufficient funds. This is the fee we incur from our bank.

CANCELLATION POLICY:

If a program needs to be cancelled, normally due to poor weather conditions, an announcement will be made on WHUD 100.7 FM. You may also access this information by calling our office. If a cancellation must be made at the "last minute", we will attempt to call all program participants.

If a program is cancelled, we will attempt to reschedule it, if possible.

REFUND POLICY:

Refunds will be issued when:

- A program is cancelled before it begins due to insufficient enrollment.
- A participant is on a waiting list.
- Medical reasons cause the participant to stop attending the program. A physicians note is requested to verify the illness.
- In the event that the participant attend the program prior to requesting a refund, a prorated portion of the program fee will be refunded.

- If your son/daughter is on a restricted diet, please send any special food or beverages to program with them.
- If your child requires medications during program time, please ensure all necessary paperwork is completed as per our agency's protocols. All medication must be given to one of the full-time staff.
- Please be sure to let us know, in writing, if someone other than yourself is going to pick your son/daughter up from a program. They must have an ID with them.
- Please notify us if there is a change in your son/daughter's health condition, medication or if they have newly diagnosed allergies.
- Please let us know if we can improve upon our services. We like to do a good job!
- Please continue to bring them to North East! We enjoy spending time with them!
